Maggie Hennefeld is Professor of Cultural Studies and Comparative Literature at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. She is the author of the award–winning book, "Specters of Slapstick and Silent Film Comediennes" and a curator of the Kino Lorber silent film collection "Cinema's First Nasty Women".

Maggie will be receiving the award at our Opening Night screening of – THE BLACK PIRATE – on Friday, September 12th at 7pm. She will also be presenting the screening of CINEMA'S FIRST NASTY WOMEN: QUEENS OF DISTRUCTION on Saturday, September 13th at 6pm.

THE DIARY OF A LOST GIRL

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14 5:15 PM

Louise Brooks was far less than the international phenomenon she became when she first arrived in Germany in 1926 to make the scandalous Pandora's Box with Pabst. Diary mounted another serious attack on bourgeois German morality with its story of a young girl raped, and sent to a morally rigid "reform school" from which she escapes and eventually works in a brothel before finding a way to rise in social standing.

MEET THE MUSICIANS



THE MONT ALTO MOTION PICTURE ORCHESTRA

Under the leadership of composer and accompanist Rodney Sauer, the five-piece Mont Alto Motion Picture Orchestra is world renowned. Mont Alto plays regularly at The Telluride Film Festival and San Francisco Silent Film Festival.



RODNEY SAUER

Rodney Sauer discovered a large archive of "photoplay music" at the University of Colorado and began using this music to compile silent film scores for small orchestras. His Mont Alto Motion Picture Orchestra is now globally recognized for its high-quality film score compilations.



HANK TROY

Hank Troy, a renowned jazz pianist and silent film accompanist, has been a key part of the Denver Silent Film Festival since its inception. He served as Music Director at The Telluride Film Festival for 25 years and helped start the summer silent film series at Boulder Chautauqua.



TENIA NELSON

Tenia is a LifeForce Jazz Records artist, pianist, percussionist, composer arranger, and educator. She co-leads a well known Denver-based jazz group, Spherio, which focuses on arranging and playing the music of Thelonious Sphere Monk and also leads the Tenia Nelson Trio.

MEET THE MUSICIANS



namebackwards

Enmanuel Alexander's solo live-looping project, "namebackwards," defies the norms of instrumental music, weaving emotionally moving soundscapes and hypnotic grooves that evoke a sense of blissful nostalgia. Enmanuel works to create a platform for underrepresented voices in the Denver music scene.



PERC ENS

Perc Ens is a minimalism percussion ensemble and performs intense, often-acoustic compositions and improvisations. Their live performance has many iterations, including perchance marimba, lights, drum set, hand percussion, sermon, or toy piano, all played to showcase the variety of melody, rhythm, and timbre.

THE DOLLHOUSE THIEVES

The Dollhouse Thieves, a Denver-based project led by Niki and Luke Tredinnick, blend neo-rock with indie-folk, featuring jazz-influenced vocals and unique instruments like accordion, clarinet, and trombone. The band members have over a decade of experience performing and writing together:




BLIND HUSBANDS



Fenella, a poor Italian girl, falls in love with a Spanish nobleman, but their affair triggers a revolution and national catastrophe.








FILIBUS, THE MYSTERIOUS AIR PILOT
